Joel's poetry powerfully swings between the seasonal extremes of want and prosperity that was common of rural existence in his time. Joel's words seem appropriate for church budget cycles – do our budgets encourage us to dream? Are our visions expansive in hopefulness or constrained by fear?

Joel said it quite clearly – God's Spirit is poured out upon all of us, washing away anything that seeks to keep our gifts hidden within us.

More than 156,000 signatures from supportive Colorado voters were delivered by ambulance to the Colorado Secretary of State (only 98,492 valid signatures were required to qualify for the ballot in 2016). Boxes of petitions were rolled into the office on a gurney with Dr. Aguilar and Nurse Nicholson attending. More and more boxes of petitions were carried by ordinary Coloradans eager to see ColoradoCare on the ballot. Thanks to all who helped collect signatures and all who signed!
