SEASON OF EASTER

A very large stone was used to seal Jesus' fate as just another tragically failed Messiah — dead, entombed, and soon forgotten. Yet it could not contain him nor the new questions that carries us into the Easter Season. The women wonder as they approach, "Who will move the stone for us?" The figures in dazzling apparel ask, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" Perhaps the power of love can bring us new life!

2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scriptures: Selections from Mark and Luke

Mark 16: 1-8

1 As soon as the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome who had bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him, 2 went to the tomb. It was very early on the first day of the week, just as the sun was rising. 3 But as they got closer they began asking each other, "Who will roll away that stone for us which blocks the entrance to the tomb?" 4 But then they looked up, and saw that the stone, which was huge, had already been rolled away.

5 When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in white, sitting on the right side, which made them a bit apprehensive.

6 But he said to them, "Don't be alarmed! You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was executed. But he is not here, he has been raised. Look, there is

the spot where they laid his body. 7 Go now and tell his disciples, particularly the one call "Rock" (Peter) that he is gone ahead of you to Galilee! There you will find him, just like he told you."

8 Immediately they left, running from the tomb, both fearful and excited. And they did not breathe a word of it to anyone because, after all they were pretty scared!

Luke 24:4-6

4 And so, while they were still uncertain about what to do, two figures in dazzling clothing suddenly appeared and stood beside them. 5 Out of sheer fright the women fell to the ground, prostrate before them. And they said to the women, "Why are you looking for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen, just like he said he would."
