Call to Worship (based on Isaiah 11:1-10)

2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scriptures: Matthew 3:1-4 and 11, Leviticus 25:1-4,8-14

Matthew 3:1 In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, ² proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³ This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'" ⁴ Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey.

Leviticus 25:1 The Lord spoke to Moses on Mount Sinai, saying: ² Speak to the people of Israel and say to them: When you enter the land that I am giving you, the land shall observe a sabbath for the Lord. ³ Six years you shall sow your field, and six years you shall prune your vineyard, and gather in their yield; ⁴ but in the seventh year there shall be a sabbath of complete

rest for the land, a sabbath for the Lord: you shall not sow your field or prune your vineyard...

⁸ You shall count off seven weeks of years, seven times seven years, so that the period of seven weeks of years gives forty-nine years. ⁹ Then you shall have the trumpet sounded loud; on the tenth day of the seventh month—on the day of atonement—you shall have the trumpet sounded throughout all your land. ¹⁰ And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family...

¹⁴ When you make a sale to your neighbor or buy from your neighbor, you shall not cheat one another.
