2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scriptures: Romans 1:18-32, 12:1-21 (Martha)

Romans 1: 18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and wickedness of those who by their wickedness suppress the truth . . .

19 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them.

28 And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind and to things that should not be done. 29 They were filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, covetousness, malice. Full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, craftiness, they are gossips,

30 slanderers, God-haters, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, rebellious toward parents, 31 foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless.

32 They know God's decree, that those who practice such things deserve to die—yet they not only do them, but even applaud others who practice them.

Romans 12:1 I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Most of us are aware of the "Freedom Riders" of 1961 — multi-racial groups who tested the desegregation of interstate transport by traveling together on buses through the south. Some were beaten, a few hospitalized, and all arrested and jailed.

But how many of us are aware of what was called, the "Reverse Freedom Rides" of 1962? Poor African Americans from the south were bussed to the north, with promises of jobs and homes that never materialized! Unfortunately nearly 60 years later, what was correctly identified by the New York Times as, "A cheap trafficking in human misery on the part of Southern racists," has returned.
