SEASON OF ADVENT

During Advent we are called to wait for the coming of God's Chosen One; the One who will help birth a new world, the world that God desires. We are simultaneously giddy with excitement and filled with anxiety since so many of the details still need to be worked out. But like intrepid investigative reporters, during our time of preparation, we must seek to uncover the who, what, where, when, and how of this great and radical Advent hope!

1. GATHERING

Musical Prelude (Steve and Cathy)

Call to Worship (based on Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11)

Leader: The spirit of the Lord GOD has anointed me and sent me to bring good news to the oppressed **People:** and to suture up the brokenhearted, proclaim liberty to both the kidnapped and those who cannot escape destruction;

L: to break out those who are in prison and to proclaim the year when all debts are canceled and to announce the moment when God's upside down rule will begin;

P: to comfort all who are in mourning and toss them garlands instead of ashes;

L: to anoint them with the oil of gladness and to envelope them with praise so that they will not faint.

P: For the LORD God loves justice and hates oppression, robbery, and wrongdoing!
L: We greatly rejoice in the LORD, our whole being exults in God our savior, for God has done great things for all of us!

P: Just like brides and grooms, God has decked us out in garments for our salvation.

L: We are giddy with excitement and breathless with anticipation as our beloved arrives. Beauty and splendor are bursting forth from the garden. All: So too will the Lord GOD cause true liberty, justice, righteousness, and praise to spring up before all the nations and people.

Opening Prayer (based on Psalm 126)

When the LORD restores creation, we will need to pinch ourselves since we will be convinced that we are dreaming. We will laugh and sing and shout for joy and all nations and people will agree, "That the LORD has done great things for us!" Restore all of your creation, O LORD God, just like overflowing streams bring life in the desert. May those who have sowed tears reap with shouts of joy.

2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scriptures: Mark 1:1-8

Now, the Good News of Jesus, God's Chosen One, begins with something that the Prophet Isaiah wrote long ago.

God says, "I will send a messenger on ahead of you, to prepare your way! A voice of one shouting from out in the wilderness: "Make ready the way of the Lord, clear out the way and make the road straight for him."
