2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scriptures: Isaiah and Matthew

Isaiah 60 (selected Verses) "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the LORD rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

"Lift up your eyes and look about you: All assemble and come to you; your sons come from afar, and your daughters are carried on the arm. Then you will look and be radiant, your heart will throb and swell with joy... Herds of camels will cover your land, young camels... will come, bearing gold and incense and proclaiming the praise of the LORD... to the honor of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has endowed you with splendor."
