2. HEARING GOD'S WORD

Scripture: Genesis 1:18-23

Genesis 1: 18 Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man (*literally, the earth creature*) should be alone; so I will make a suitable partner." 19 So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air and brought them to the earth creature to see what he ("they" actually, since the earth creature was still lacking a gender) would call them... 20 The earth creature gave names to all cattle and to the birds of the air and to every animal of the field; but there was not found among them a true partner.

21 So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the earth creature and they slept; then the Lord God took one of their ribs and closed up its place with flesh. 22 And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man (gender now was simultaneously created). 23 Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken." (Taken from the side of man to stand side by side, that is!)
