Luke 7: 20 When the Disciples of John the Baptist came to visit Jesus, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to ask you, "Are you the expected one, or are we to wait for someone else?" "

21 Now Jesus had just cured many people of diseases and plagues and evil spirits and had given sight to many who were blind. 22 And so he answered them, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have good news brought to them. 23 And congratulations to those who are not offended by what I'm doing."
